PALM SUNDAY ANNUNCIATION

MARK 11:1-10

Reader: ¹When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, [Jesus] sent two of his disciples ²and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. ³If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately.'"

⁴They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. 

We lift our prayers to you, O God, trusting in your steadfast love and your promise to renew your whole creation; through Jesus Christ our Savior.




Please come forward by way of the center aisle and receive the bread from the pastor and the wine from the assistant.


Coffee Hour host for April and May are needed! If you can't host please consider picking up or baking some treats that can be frozen and used at a later date!
